



KIRKS PHOTOGRAPHY



The cold weather makes it hard to get motivated to go outdoors and shoot, but there are some great photo opportunities to be had in winter. Make certain you dress for the cold and watch for ice!

Even when there is no snow, icy pond make great subjects. Look for ducks, geese, or sea gulls standing on the ice. Ice also makes for great reflection images. Many normal scenes take on a new meaning in the cold of winter

After a snowfall there are great shots everywhere. The challenge with snow shots is getting the proper exposure.

A very bright snowy scene tricks you camera into thinking there is too much light, so the camera will cut back on exposure. This makes the snow in your images look gray. If you know how to set your exposure compensation, increase the exposure by 1 stop to brighten the snow. If your camera has "scene" modes, use the one for snow or beach.


The bare leafless trees make nice silhouette shots and are very good for black and white photography.



They are especially effective with a sunrise or sunset behind them.



Appetizers or is it HORS D'OEUVRE?


The French call them "hors D'oeuvre" which means "outside the masterpiece"

Appetizer means "to build the appetite"

The ancient Romans and Greeks were, and are, well known for stretching a meal as a means of great social conversation and entertainment. **So, with that said...** appetizers were introduced ...

Trays were arranged with fresh fruit, cheeses, olives, seasonal vegetables & fish. The addition of small meats entered into the appy menu during the Renaissance (14th - 17th centuries). In the 19th century, it became common practice for "MULTI" course dinners to start with the "appetizer"...

As I searched around our community for sharing recipes... I began speaking to Pat Gail while enjoying a day at the pool. (our pool seems to be the best place to talk food, EVERYONE offers GREAT recipes, as well as their favorite restaurants & supermarkets in our area) Pat gave the idea of fun appetizers & I thank her so much for it. Surely, she has an outstanding interest in eating good food & wine!



Here is Pat's recipe for ANTIPASTO on a skewer:

Place 1 piece of each of the following onto a 3" skewer... grape or sundried tomato, choice of olive, mozzarella ball or favorite Italian cheese, small roasted or vinegar pepper & a small piece of any cured meat, pepperoni, dried salami or prosciutto...

From the Brunas' Family cookbook: **Mashed potaotes**: boil 20 small red or white potatoes...drain & cool. <u>PREHEAT</u> oven to 425 dgr...<u>Spray</u> a large cookie sheet with oil & place the cooled potatoes on sheet & smash with a fork 1/4" thick...<u>In a sauce pot</u>: melt 1-2 sticks of butter, chives & parsley. Add S & P. <u>Bake</u> in preheated oven until golden brown.

From a friend in Leisure Village West:

Belgian Endive Stuffers

4 green onions (finely chopped)

1 lb. shrimp (cleaned, cooked & chopped)

1/2 cup Miracle Whip dressing

4 tsp. Sriracha sauce (hot chili sauce)

****In a bowl combine well all the above ****

You will need 20 Belgian Endive leaves (washed & paper towel dried) ... approx. 3 heads.

Fill each leaf & garnish well with a touch of dried parsley & paprika.



PRIORITY FOR DRIVEWAY SNOW REMOVAL

For those who qualify, please submit your request to assure that you will be placed on the priority list. To qualify, a resident must require regular life-sustaining medical treatment, such as chemotherapy, radiation, or dialysis in or outside the home.

A "heart condition" does not qualify. Your request must be accompanied by a physician's script/note which specifies that life-sustaining treatment for any of the conditions outlined above is necessary. Hand written notes are unacceptable. All information will be kept by the Administrator and will be confidential. Your need to go to work does not qualify for priority snow removal. We suggest you make advance arrangements with a private contractor for snow removal.

The township will cooperate by plowing our roads so that our contractor can begin work. Of course, the town will continue to respond to any serious problems during storms.

ALWAYS CALL 911 FOR ANY MEDICAL EMERGENCY.

Please be sure to keep on hand extra supplies of medications and food, so that there is no need to leave the house during or immediately after a snowstorm. The weather predictions generally provide ample warning time for making preparations.
